We have once again assembled a wonderful staff that includes over 400 talented, dedicated, and caring adults who will do a great job working with our children.

As each of us in the SDMA gets ready to begin the school year, we will be moving forward with our school district's mission of preparing ALL students to become lifelong learners, caring individuals, and responsible citizens. Our shared vision for continuous improvement includes a common understanding of the goals set before us

BUS RIDING INSTRUCTIONS for ALL STUDENTS

The School District of the Menomonie Area contracts bus services with Menomonie Transportation. School Board Policy outlines transportation eligibility and requirements.

All new kindergarten students, 6th graders, and 9th graders who are eligible for busing are newly assigned to routes; other students will continue as previously routed unless the bus company is notified of changes. Those not planning to use transportation are asked to contact the bus company to cancel service.

Busing begins Tuesday, August 29, 2023.

Details regarding bus routes will be available at school orientation. If the information is needed prior to orientation, parents may call the bus company beginning August 15th. Those in need of service from a site other than their home location are asked to call the bus company to explore options as soon as possible. Parents are also asked to communicate daily the need to cancel busing if a student is ill or absent.

- Refrain from using the back row of seats unless others are full.
- Become silent at railroad crossings.



- Bring lost and found items to the driver's attention.
- Use electronic equipment responsibly.

- Know your bus number and driver's name.
- Ride only assigned transfer buses.
- Clearly label all personal items.
- Secure proper written passes from the office for guests.
- Contact the bus company regarding special requests or changes.
- Accept accountability for your words and actions.
- Know emergency exits and evacuation plan.
- Respect the "No Eating & No Drinking" rule.
- Help to maintain a clean bus.
- Report illegal or inappropriate activities to the driver.
