

- All surveys include a one-time-use access code.






Survey Information

- +/- 2.21% margin of error






What is your age?

Is your primary residence in the School District of Menomonie Area?







Background Information

Financial Challenges

Even with the recently approved budget, state funding has not kept up with increasing costs. At the same time, since 2013-14, the District's property tax mill rate has dropped by 43% as shown in the chart.

Together, this situation has made it very difficult to keep up with increasing costs for such things as transportation/fuel, utilities, compensation, insurance, technology, and special education services.

After studying our needs and projections, the District is asking voters to consider an operational referendum. Unlike more than 70% of school districts in Wisconsin, the School District of the Menomonie Area has not secured this type of funding in more than 30 years.

A referendum that provides \$4.2 million each year on a recurring/ongoing basis would help pay for:

- \checkmark Maintaining class sizes.
- \checkmark Maintaining current programs, services, and student extra-curricular activities.
- \checkmark Continuing to offer courses such as career & tech ed, agriculture, fine arts, and foreign language.
- \checkmark Funding building maintenance.
- \checkmark Providing salaries competitive with nearby schools and local businesses.







Property Tax Mill Rates



Additional Analysis: Would you support a \$4.2 million operational referendum?



Weighted support for *Definitely yes and Probably yes:* 0.25 (60%) + 0.75 (46%) = <u>49.5%</u>

✓ 16% of Parents were undecided
✓ 24% of Non-Parents/Non-Staff were undecided
✓ Margin for error was +/- 2.2%





What did we learn?

- If held today, the operational referendum would be too close to call, but support is within the margin for error.
- There was not support for any of the cost cutting options.
- "I'm not sure/I need more information" was much higher than normal with resident Non-staff/Non-parents, and they represent 75% of the community.
